

## Oscar Lewisohn's dedication

In everlasting gratitude, this gift of DKK 100,000 is given to the Danish Jewish Museum, Copenhagen, in memory of the late Captain Jørgen Jensen, Gilleleje.

In human compassion, ignoring the danger, Captain Jensen sailed his motor vessel, the "Elisabeth", fearlessly from Gilleleje to Falsterbo in Sweden, at 5am on the 30<sup>th</sup> of September 1943, with the Lewisohn family hidden on board. In doing so Captain Jensen risked his own life to save ours.

Alone at the helm Captain Jensen rescued the Lewisohn family consisting of Mathias Max Lewisohn, his wife Jenny Lewisohn, their daughters Alice and Birte and their still surviving children Inge Aasted and son Oscar Lewisohn from their intended fate at the hands of the brutal Nazi occupation regime in Denmark. Captain Jensen later saved other Danish countrymen to safety in Sweden.

Captain Jensen was born in Genner, Aabenraa on the 26<sup>th</sup> of June 1913. He died on the 24<sup>th</sup> of September 1993, in Randers. Ever loyal to his country and to King Christian X, may he always be remembered with honor.

This gift will support the project "The Swedish Refugee Protocols from October 1943". It is dedicated to the Danish Jewish Museum following recent consultations with Mrs. Annelise Kahr, Randers, daughter of Captain Jørgen Jensen.
